About Precertification Education

HOPE & HOME

Precertification education is important for two main reasons. It is required by the State of Colorado for your licensure as foster parents. But more importantly, it is crucial to your journey as foster parents. We believe that foster parenting is one of the hardest jobs you may ever do. With that in mind, we want to help set you up for success.

How Do I Access My Precertification Education?

All education at Hope & Home will take place via Hope & Home's online learning system, called DaVinci. It's our goal to make sure that courses are accessible, engaging, and meaningful.

Our expectation of you is that you will come prepared to engage with course content and to reflectively apply it to your foster parent experience. We also expect you to complete courses on your own. Because education credits are tracked on an individual basis, each individual must have their own DaVinci account and complete their education individually. This means that spouses cannot share accounts with each other or complete trainings on behalf of their spouse.

How Long Does Training Take?

Training typically takes between 30-60 days. When training is completed more quickly, we've found that it can be difficult to retain all the information presented. When training is completed too slowly, it's difficult to recall what was learned. While you will not be assigned a precertification training due date, it is important to complete training in a timely manner. You will be awarded a certificate of completion for each course that expires one year after it is obtained. All certificates must be valid at time of licensure.
